

St Antony's Catholic Primary School Art & Design Curriculum Overview 2022-23

Overview:

The highest forms of human creativity are found in Art, Craft and Design. Providing a high-quality art and design education should engage, inspire and challenge pupils, equipping them with the knowledge and skills to experiment, invent and create their own works of art, craft and design. As pupils progress, they should be able to think critically and develop a more rigorous understanding of art and design. They should also know how art and design both reflect and shape our collective history and cultures.

Subject Content - Key Stage 1

Pupils will be taught:

- To use a range of materials creatively to design and make artefacts
- To use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their thoughts, experiences and imagination
- To develop a wide range of art and design techniques in cooperating the use of colour, pattern, texture, line, shape, form and space
- All pupils will learn about the work of a range of artists, craft makers and designers, evaluating the differences and similarities between different practices and disciplines, while making links to their own work.

Subject Content - Key Stage 2

Pupils will be taught to develop their techniques, including their control and their use of materials, with creativity, experimentation and an increasing awareness of different kinds of art, craft and design.

Pupils will explore:

- Drawing and sketching from their observations to create 'Still Life' reviewing fine- tuning ideas
- To improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials :crayons, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay and paper
- To learn about great artists, architects and designers from a range of cultural backgrounds
