### This means that we:

- Welcome and show respect for families and children of all faiths... as the word 'Catholic' means universal. We also expect Parents' to respect our staff and ethos.
- We pray at least 4 times daily which makes us similar to families of other faiths (Muslim, Hindu, Sikh) within our school. We have whole school assemblies 3 times weekly and whole school prayer and liturgy in Church at least once per half term and on Special Feast Days.
- We are inclusive because we cater to children of a broad range of Cultures, Ethnicities, Faiths and abilities: Gifted and Talented, More Able, Able and those with SEND needs. We support all to be their best!

Home/ School Agreement: By choosing St Antony's all parents have agreed to support our ethos, policies and procedures.

## What Do We Expect Of Our EYFS Parents?



- ► To model the expected attitudes, work ethic and approach we want our children to emulate daily.
- To observe the school rules and policies, being examples to all our children-supporting the school positively
- ► To ensure all children are present, punctual and fully compliant daily- in behaviour & correct uniform
- To secure that each child has a good learning and study structure in place at home and is properly supervised/monitored with Reading & Home work daily

### **We Are Strict On School Procedures**

- School starts at 8.45 am promptly for all daily! A child
  is officially registered as being late at 9:01am.
   Parents are held responsible for late pupils!
- PM sessions for Nursery and Viridis begin at 12:30pm
- ALL SCHOOL GATES ARE CLOSED AT 9AM SHARP EACH DAY.
- Absences & Lateness are strictly monitored as these are indicators of a range of Child Protection and Safeguarding issues- these are also monitored by Newham Borough as they will check on poor attenders and send the relevant Social Service officers to pupils' homes to check.
  - Attendance at St. Antony's is among the highest in borough at 95-97%-we are working to get even higher.
- Late pupils must enter through the main office for Safeguarding and our school records

### **More School Practice & Procedures**

- We ask that all our Nursery 3 to 4 year olds come to us fully potty trained and not in nappies
- We require all to be in full school uniform described below:
- ▶ Bottle Green Jogging Bottoms, Plain yellow polo shirt-with or without school crest
- ▶ Bottle Green round neck Jumper with the school's crest
- Sensible black children's school shoes/trainers with velcro preferably
- White, black or grey socks (this uniform is also their PE Kit)
- All school uniforms are available at Ian Howard uniform stores

- \*Pre-owned uniforms can also be secured from the school's Welfare Officer Mrs Samuel or The Inclusion Manager Miss Baptiste.
- All parts of your child's uniform must be labelled clearly with their name-Please use ink that will not wash out (eg Sharpie/permanent marker)
- Spare Clothes: All children are asked to take in spare sets of clothes to change in case of 'accidents'- these DO NOT have to be uniform just ordinary clothes.

- ► The New RE Curriculum is being introduced across all EYFS Phase Groups of all Catholic Primary Schools this academic year 2023-2024.
- The curriculum is focused on children learning about the fact that their faith is central to their daily lives

## What's The Practice In EYFS?



#### **Practitioners**

- observe and understand each child's development and learning, assess progress, plan for and act on next steps
- support babies and children to develop a positive sense of their own identity and culture
- identify any need for additional support
- keep children safe
- value and respect all children and families equally

#### Positive relationships are

- warm and loving, and foster a sense of belonging
- sensitive and responsive to the child's individual needs, feelings and interests
- supportive of the child's own efforts and independence
- consistent in setting clear boundaries
- stimulating
- built on key person relationships in early years settings

#### **Enabling Environments**

- value all people
- value development and learning

#### They offer

- stimulating resources and spaces, inside and outside, relevant to all the children's cultures and communities
- rich learning opportunities through play and playful teaching
- support for children to take risks and explore
