Overarching Aim: To Demonstrate The Inextricable Links Between Our Spiritual, Moral, Social and Cultural Aspects of Learning, British Values and teachings on Citizenship Across The Curriculum



Context: Each year in Spring 1 our schools engage in a programme of work covering The SMSC & Citizenship Aims of the curriculum linked to RE.

Deriving The Theme: All the RE Leads & Teams across the MAT meet, discuss & agree a **central theme and key actions and content to be covered by all schools** annually linked to our Catholic Vision, Values & Mission.

Designing and structuring the Programme of Work and how it will be delivered is the responsibility of the RE/SMSC/Citizenship Lead of each school.

As RE/SMSC/Citizenship Lead of St Antony's, I (Miss Wade) design and outline the programme of work which is delivered over the 6 weeks of Spring 1 annually –discussing the plans firstly with the Head who is the co-lead for this area of the curriculum, then with my SMSC/Citizenship Team of staff drawn from across the school inclusive of EYFS, KS1 and KS2 teachers and support staff.

The programme structure and coverage is shared with all staff at the Spring 1 Inset Day (5th January 2024 this year)

The Theme Broken Down: "Wonderfully Made"



Is base on the scripture text found in Psalm 139 which highlights a fundamental teaching of our faith -that each of us as a human being is a wonderful work of art made by God and that this should be treasured and celebrated.

Makes direct reference to our British and Gospel laws on equality and diversity and references what is happening currently in the UK and the world to spark deep discussion and debateamong staff and pupils :


- To develop sound awareness and understanding of British Values: Rule of Law, Democracy, Tolerance Respect and Liberty which secures and safeguards all

- To understand, explore and establish "Who is my neighbor?" socially, morally, politically using the morals taught by Jesus in the story of The Good Samaritan-using role play, drama, Reading and Comprehension- looking at themes featured: Racism, Love, Compassion, Responsibility
- To Visit West Ham and the Olympic Park, The Docklands to explore God's Creation first hand. Read, discuss and analyse Pope Francis' Teachings on-Ladauto Si and Fratelli Tutti-establishing our personal and collective responsibility for our common home the Earth and each other.
- To study, analyse and foster a deeper understanding of Catholic Social Teaching and British Values -knowing for every right we have and defend, there is a moral, cultural civic and social responsibility-ensuring we do not compromise the rights and freedoms of others by our words and actions.


