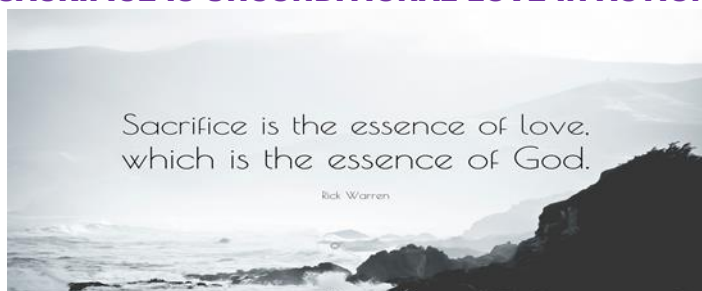

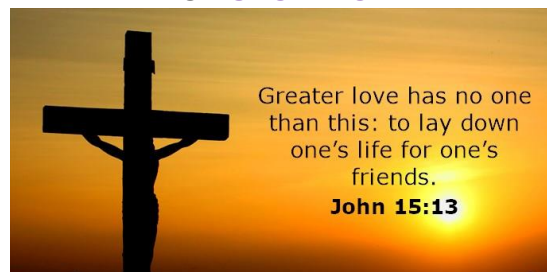

SACRIFICE IS UNCONDITIONAL LOVE IN ACTION



From The Head Teacher's Desk

This week we celebrate the Virtues and Values
Of: **SACRIFICE**



As Catholics we believe that God so loves the world – including you and me, that He gave His only Son to die on Calvary on a cross to set us free from sin (John 3:16).

Jesus became the final sacrifice, the **Lamb of God** who takes away all our sins.

We believe that Jesus became incarnate (became human like us) in every way while He walked the face of the earth. We believe that he was tempted as much as we all are, but he resisted sin and temptation and lived without sin while human. Why did he do this? To demonstrate to us that **it is possible to live a life without sin...but this holy and sinless life does not happen without serious sacrifice!** It is for this reason that holy men and women across the world from our faith and other faiths remove themselves from certain temptations of life in their effort to serve God fully, totally and completely. We only need to think of: Mother Theresa and other religious sisters and brothers, Tibetan Monks, Hindu Swamis and Buddhist Monastics they all make heavy personal sacrifices so that they can focus totally on serving God and His people.

Jesus Christ, The Son of God died in sacrifice for the sins of all humanity. His life, as the creator of all humanity, is of greater value than the sum total of all human life. His death was, therefore, a sufficient and substantial sacrifice to pay the penalty for the sins of all-those who believe and even those who choose not to. In paying this penalty He has made it possible, according to God's plan, for each of us and for humanity as a whole, to have our sins forgiven and to be released from the death penalty of sin. Sacrifice is LOVE!
